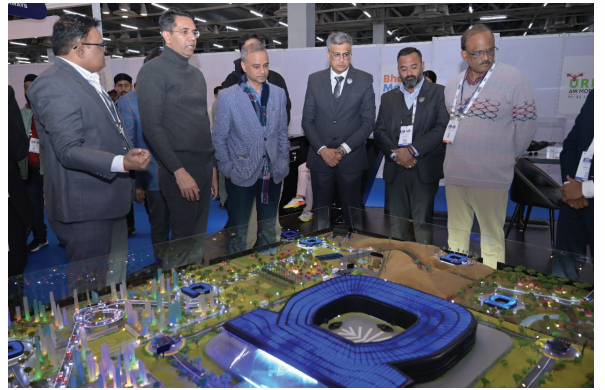

Transformative Dialogues at UMIS 2025 Shaping India's Mobility Future

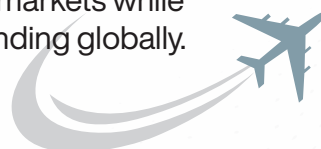

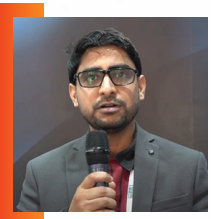
